2018 Annual Report

The CCHS Foundation is a division of the CCHS Network, a 501(c)(3) charity. Together, we champion scientific advances that will empower individuals living with Congenital Central Hypoventilation Syndrome (CCHS) and their loved ones to live full and productive lives. Our vision is a future where CCHS is no longer a life-threatening diagnosis. In its fourth year of existence, the CCHS Foundation continued to evolve both in effort and impact, with a focus on community involvement, international advocacy, and corporate outreach. The 4th Annual International CCHS Day raised \$138,703.70, a 27% increase from 2017. When combined with private door expansion, social media campaigns, and the Arch of Hope fundraiser, the Foundation easily surpassed its \$150k annual goal, raising over \$257k. From these efforts, two research projects will be funded. In addition, monies raised sponsored the 5th International CCHS Research Conference at the Chase Park Plaza Hotel in St. Louis, MO, June 20 – 23, 2018. The conference provided a platform for advancing research efforts, boosting education, and fostering collaboration between scientists, clinicians, and patients. The CCHS Foundation sincerely thanks all our supporters who made this year one of merit, validation, and hope. Your work and devotion is transforming the future of 1200+ individuals who live each day being BRAVE, RESILIENT, and DETERMINED.


OUR MISSION



MOVING MOUNTAINS

Through the remarkable fundraising efforts of the CCHS community in 2017, the CCHS Foundation secured funding for two groundbreaking research projects in 2018. Grants were awarded to Dr. Patrice Guyenet, Ph.D. at the University of Virginia and Dr. Raffaele Piumelli, M.D. at the Meyer Children Hospital, Florence, Italy. Dr. Guyenet's project aims to better understand the regulation of breathing when asleep and awake. Dr. Piumelli is examining the effects of oxidative stress in CCHS patients.

INTERNATIONAL CCHS DAY

The CCHS Foundation proudly sponsored the 4th Annual International CCHS Day titled CCHS Ties Us *Together* on **November 10, 2018**. CCHS families and supporters from around the world participated by posting videos of friends and family "tied together" in support of CCHS on a dedicated hal CCH Facebook event page. Additional fundraisers included dine and donates, t-shirt sales, a gala, individual Facebook fundraising campaigns, and a high school fundraiser.
